On November 12th, the State's Forest Practices Board voted to update a rule allowing for larger forest buffers along headwater streams. National Highlight

The Conference of Parties (COP), which is the annual international climate conference between nations, was held in Belém this month. COP 30 was titled the "implementation" COP, meaning the agenda focused less on *what* needed to be done but *how* nations work together on climate. Where Do Climate Commitment Act Dollars Go?

Following funding from polluters to projects statewide.

The Climate Commitment Act (CCA) was passed in 2021 and is funded by a carbon tax. There has been ongoing debate on how funds are allocated, and the state recently released detailed project lists of projects funded by the CCA. In 2024 and 2025, over 75 projects were funded in Jefferson and Clallam Counties. They can be viewed visually on [this](#) mapping dashboard from the Department of Ecology.
